Periodontal Disease

Description

Periodontal disease, which is inflammation and infection of gum tissue, occurs when plaque and tartar are allowed to build up on teeth. It progresses to gum recession, and bone and tooth loss.

Early Detection

Recommended: oral exams twice a year and annual dental cleanings.

Why Needed

Periodontal disease can contribute to:

- Pain
- Difficulty eating
- Jaw bone and/or tooth loss
- Kidney, liver and heart disease
- Behavioral changes

Patellar Luxation

Description

Patella luxation is when the kneecap pops out of place. This is due to the groove in the femur being too shallow or the ligaments that hold the kneecap in place pulling it off to the side.

Early Detection

Recommended: orthopedic examinations twice a year. Your veterinarian may also discuss weight management as a preventive measure.

Why Needed

Patellar luxation can contribute to:

- Pain
- Arthritis
- Scraping of the kneecap against the femur
- Reduced mobility
- The need for surgery in severe cases

Diabetes

Description

Diabetes mellitus is a serious medical condition where your pet cannot control their blood sugar levels due to problems with insulin production or function. Common symptoms include drinking and urinating more than normal, along with unexplained weight loss or gain.

Early Detection

Recommended: annual urinalysis and bloodwork to check blood glucose levels, liver and kidney function.

Why Needed

Diabetes can contribute to:

- Liver and kidney damage
- Hyperglycemia
- Lethargy
- Cataracts
- Shortened life expectancy

Glaucoma

Description

Glaucoma is a very painful condition in which fluid in the eye cannot drain as fast as it is being produced, leading to excessive pressure. The pressure crushes the lining of the retina.

Early Detection

Recommended: comprehensive exams twice a year, intraocular pressure check.

Why Needed

Glaucoma can contribute to:

- Extreme pain
- Squinting
- Watery, irritated eyes
- Swollen or bulging eyes
- Blindness
